



## New Hampshire's Highs and Lows Trip Information

### What to Expect when you get on the bus:

Since we can not meet, usually, before your trip, since you may not live near us, we wanted to give you a brief idea of what you might expect.

#### Day 1:

We start by traveling through North Conway, NH on our way to Arethusa Falls. We will be making several stops to pick-up campers along the way. You may be the first on the bus or the sixth, either way when you board the bus there will be a short introduction to campers who have already arrived. During the initial tour we will store your gear in one of the bunks and then hit the road. As it will be early in the morning when we leave, we often play a movie while everyone wakes up. As we travel we will play some games and begin getting to know each other. At Arethusa Falls we will enjoy a great 1.6 miles hike up to the falls. From Arethusa it is just a short drive to our campground in Twin Mountain, NH for the night. On the way to camp we will divide our group into two "work crews". (Don't be scared, it shouldn't cause any blisters.) But as we are a team everyone will need to pitch in - I am sure it will be fun. Each crew will have a chance to help cook, clean, and refuel the bus. Depending on weather some things to do at camp may include swimming, playing ball, cooking S'mores on the campfire, playing cards or listening to a story.

#### Day 2:

We will start the day with a great camp breakfast and enjoying the campground before heading up to Mt. Washington. We will board the Mt. Washington Cog Railroad at 12:00 for a three hour tour up and back from the summit. From here we have a 2.5 hour trip in the bus through Franconia Notch to our next campground in the town of Lee in southern New Hampshire. We will again enjoy camp before a much needed nights sleep.

#### Day 3:

Hope you are ready to get wet! Today is Water County Water Park. After breaking camp we will spend the majority of the day playing at the park before heading back to Maine around 3:00. We hope this gives you a little heads up and are sure that we will all have a great time.
