



## Just Do It Trip Information

### June 29<sup>th</sup> to July 1<sup>st</sup>

#### What to Expect when you get on the bus:

##### Day 1:

We will be making several stops to pick-up campers along the way as we head to Center Conway, NH and our first adventure canoeing on the Saco River. You may be the first on the bus or the sixth, either way when you board the bus there will be a short introduction to campers who have already arrived. During the initial tour of the bus we will store your gear in one of the bunks and then hit the road. As it will be early in the morning when we leave, we often play a movie while everyone wakes up. As we travel we will play some games and begin getting to know each other. On the way we will divide our group into “work crews”. (Don’t be scared, it shouldn’t cause any blisters) but as we are a team everyone will need to pitch in - I am sure it will be fun. Each crew will have a chance to help cook, clean, and refuel the bus. We will be canoeing from the Saco Bound base camp to the “Pig Farm” take-out. After a great time on the river we will take the short ride to Eastern Slope Campground in North Conway, NH. Depending on weather some things to do at camp may include swimming, playing ball, cooking S’mores on the campfire, playing cards or listening to a story.

##### Day 2:

We will start the day with a great camp breakfast and enjoying the campground before traveling to Fryeburg, ME and climbing Jockey Cap. From here we will swim (weather dependent) and walk around the village of North Conway. When we are ready we will return to camp for dinner, campfire and more.

##### Day 3:

After breakfast we will break camp and head to Monkey Trunks Adventure Course in Chocorua, NH. This is New England's largest high rope and zipline park.
